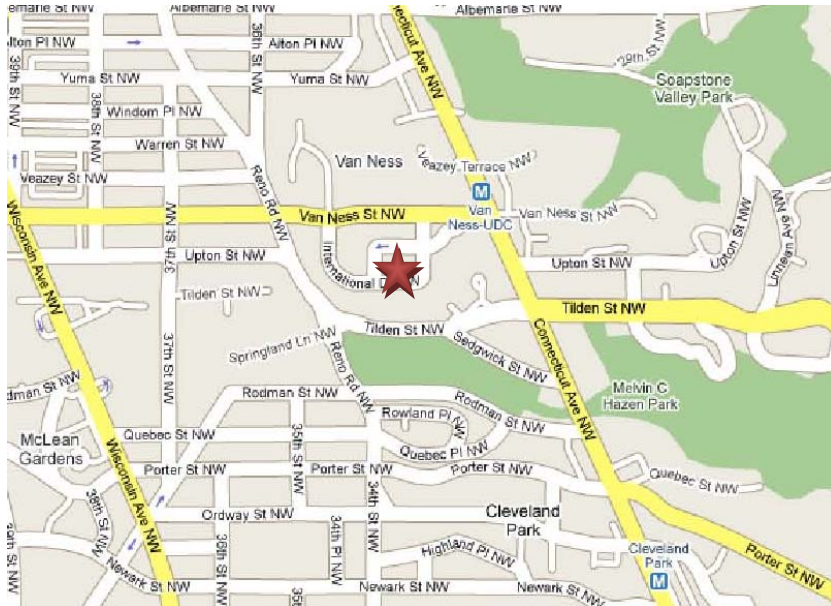

# LOCATION AND LOGISTICS

WASHINGTON, DC 20008



By Washington Metropolitan Metrorail IntelSAT is two blocks from the Van Ness – UDC station on the Red line. Leaving the Metro station:

- At the top of the escalator inside the station, turn left to take the UDC exit.
- At street level, turn to the right and walk one block to Van Ness.
- Please enter the building via the International Drive entrance, NOT the Connecticut Avenue/Van Ness entrance.
- Turn right at Van Ness and walk one block to International Drive NW on the left.

There is no parking available at IntelSAT. There is a parking garage at UDC (University of the District of Columbia) that is accessible from Van Ness, and there is a parking garage under Giant Groceries directly across from the Metro station.

The dress standard for all events is professional business attire for civilian participants and any non-utility uniform for military personnel (i.e., any form of “blues” for Air Force or Class B uniform for Army and Navy) unless primary military duties dictate otherwise.
