• Key question: What role does Russia *currently* play in international fora that address space sustainability and security issues?

• Answer:

- Leading space power
- Navigating between the other two space powers, the US and China

• Cases:

- COPUOS & the LTSSA Working Group
- Conference on Disarmament & the PPWT
- UNGA First Committee & the GGE

- United Nations Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space (COPUOS):
 - Negotiates civil space issues
 - Two subcommittees: Legal and Scientific & Technical
- LTSSA Working Group: Long-term Sustainability of Space Activities
- Terms of Reference in June 2011:
 - Russia played an obstructive role
 - Insistent on State-centric format

Promoting Cooperative Solutions for Space Sustainability

- Conference on Disarmament (CD): Charged with negotiating Prevention of an Arms Race in Outer Space (PAROS), deadlocked for 15 years
- PPWT: draft Treaty on the Prevention of the Placement of Weapons in Outer Space, the Threat or Use of Force against Outer Space Objects
 - Draft submitted to CD in 2008
 - Three main goals: no weapons in space, no use of force or threat of use of force against space objects
 - Blocked by United States
- Russia seems more flexible than China on the PPWT

- United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) First Committee: the UNGA body that negotiates Disarmament and International Security issues
- Resolution 63/68 and the GGE on space TCBMs
 - Sponsored by Russia

Promoting Cooperative Solutions for Space Sustainability

- Calls for Secretary-General to establish Group of Governmental Experts (GGE) to examine Transparency and Confidence-building Measures (TCBMs) in Outer Space Activities
- Goal is to produce a consensus report with recommendations on TCBMs
- 15 experts will meet at three meetings: July 23-27, 2012 in NYC; April 1-5, 2013 in Geneva; and July 8-12, 2013 in NYC
- Group composition and Chairmanship will be decided next year

 - Key question: What role does Russia currently play in international fora that address space sustainability and security issues? What role *can* Russia play?
 - Answer: In three key bodies, Russia maintains its position as a leading spacepower and is trying to navigate between the other two dominant forces, the United States and China
 - This works because the US and Russia have an established an effective working relationship on space issues
 - Also works because Russia has, thus far, been supportive of shared space sustainability goals
 - Graham Allison and Robert Blackwill on why Russia still matters:
 - Russia is still a leading spacepower
 - Russia can help determine whether or not China plays responsibly in space
